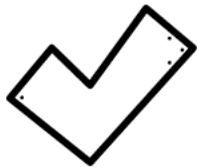
Hello Parents,

We are learning all about Friendship. We defined friendship as: Making and keeping a friend through mutual trust, caring, and shared interests.

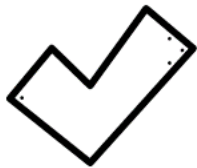
Here are some ways you can teach Friendship to your child at home:

***Week 2:** We are continuing to learn all about Friendship. Remember friendship means making and keeping a friend through mutual trust, caring, and shared interests. Some ways that you can show friendship at home are call, text, and check on friends, teach a friend a skill or talent you have, attend friend's parties/events, and keep in touch.

***Week 3:** We are continuing to learn all about Friendship. Remember friendship means making and keeping a friend through mutual trust, caring, and shared interests. Some ways that you can show friendship in your community is by joining a sports team, introducing yourself on the playground, helping a neighbor, and keeping your promises.

***Week 4:** As we continue to learn about Friendship, let's reflect on this quote by John Evelyn, "Friendship is the golden thread that ties the heart of all the world." This means that we are all connected (or could be) through friendship and love. What is one way you will be a friend today?

***Week 5:** Friendship is an essential trait to have for many careers. Zoologists for example show a lot of friendship. Zoologists study animals and how they interact with their ecosystems. They conduct research on animal communication, reproduction, migration patterns, and disease transmission. Zoologists work closely with animals in their habitat and help to rehabilitate them. In order to do this, Zoologists gain the animals trust and help them thrive. They interact with the animals, find out how to help them, and treat them if they are sick. Zoologists also play an important role in conservation strategies to protect endangered species. Think of a career you may be interested in and how you can show friendship in it.

***Week 6:** Friendship is also shown by many leaders throughout history and is an important feature of being a leader. Two such leaders were Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton. In May 1851, these two leaders began a friendship which lasted over fifty years. Anthony and Stanton inspired each other to fight for change. They were abolitionists, activists, and, champions for women's rights and suffrage. As a single woman, Anthony was free of many of the domestic duties that tied Stanton to her home, which allowed Anthony to travel and make speeches for women's rights. To give Stanton time to write those speeches, Anthony visited her and helped care for her large family. SUSAN B. ANTHONY & ELIZABETH CADY STANTON



In May 1851, Susan B. Anthony met Elizabeth Cady Stanton and began a friendship which lasted over fifty years. Anthony and Stanton inspired each other to fight for change. They were abolitionists, activists, and, champions for women's rights and suffrage. As a single woman, Anthony was free of many of the domestic duties that tied Stanton to her home, which allowed Anthony to travel and make speeches for women's rights. To give Stanton time to write those speeches, Anthony visited her and helped care for her large family. She then took the speeches and writings produced by Stanton and traveled the countryside campaigning for women's rights. On their friendship Stanton said "...we took turns on the domestic watchtowers, directing amusements, settling disputes, protecting the weak against the strong, and trying to secure equal rights to all in the home as well as the nation."

CAREERS THAT SHOW

FRIENDSHIP ZOOLOGISTS



Zoologists study animals and how they interact with their ecosystems.

They work in a variety of settings, such as universities, government agencies, zoos, museums, and research institutions. They conduct research on animal communication, reproduction, migration patterns, and disease transmission. Zoologists work closely with animals in their habitat and help to rehabilitate them. In order to do this, Zoologists gain the animals trust and help them thrive. They interact with the animals, find out how to help them, and treat them if they are sick. Zoologists also play an important role in conservation strategies to protect endangered species.

LEADERS THAT SHOW

FRIENDSHIP SUSAN B. ANTHONY & ELIZABETH CADY STANTON



In May 1851, Susan B. Anthony met Elizabeth Cady Stanton and began a friendship which lasted over fifty years. Anthony and Stanton inspired each other to fight for change. They were abolitionists, activists, and, champions for women's rights and suffrage. As a single woman, Anthony was free of many of the domestic duties that tied Stanton to her home, which allowed Anthony to travel and make speeches for women's rights. To give Stanton time to write those speeches, Anthony visited her and helped care for her large family. She then took the speeches and writings produced by Stanton and traveled the countryside campaigning for women's rights. On their friendship Stanton said "...we took turns on the domestic watchtowers, directing amusements, settling disputes, protecting the weak against the strong, and trying to secure equal rights to all in the home as well as the nation."
