Directions Page 1:

This lesson will take approximately 45 minutes to teach.

Recommended Sequence:

- Review the PowerPoint or digital for Google Slides presentation.
- Review the discussion cards in small groups or whole group.
- Complete the craft, a worksheet, or a coloring page.
- Display the posters in your space if you'd like!

PowerPoint Presentation:

This presentation teaches students the meaning of generosity and how to be generous to others. It first reviews the definition of generosity. Next, it tells the story of a little girl named Maria who creates homemade gifts for 6 of her friends. Maria learns that the most special gifts come from the heart! After the story, the presentation offers 3 discussion questions for students to "turn and talk" with a partner. Then, students learn 6 ways to be generous, and how generosity feels for both us and the recipient of our kindness.

Discussion Cards:

12 discussion cards are included in both full color and black/white. You may choose to ask students to discuss these in small groups or large group. They review the story, the meaning of generosity, and help students connect the material to their own lives.

Directions Page 2:

Craft:

6 versions of an adorable craft are included! 3 boys and 3 girls are offered for the clipart kids. Please let students choose the clipart kid that looks the most like them! Please give each student a page with the clipart kid and a page with the "Generosity Means to Me" frame. First, students color the clipart kid and the "Generosity Means to Me" frame. Then, they write on the lines what generosity means to them. Next, they cut out the clipart kid and the frame. Finally, they glue the frame onto the clipart kid, underneath his/her arms as shown in the sample on the next page. These would make for an adorable bulletin board or hallway display!

Posters:

2 posters are included that are perfect for instruction, reviewing the material, and to display in your space!

Worksheets & Coloring Pages:

2 worksheets and 7 coloring pages are included that review generosity with students. Please choose the pages that best fit the needs of your students and the amount of time that you have!
