Bessie Cow Learns about Loss



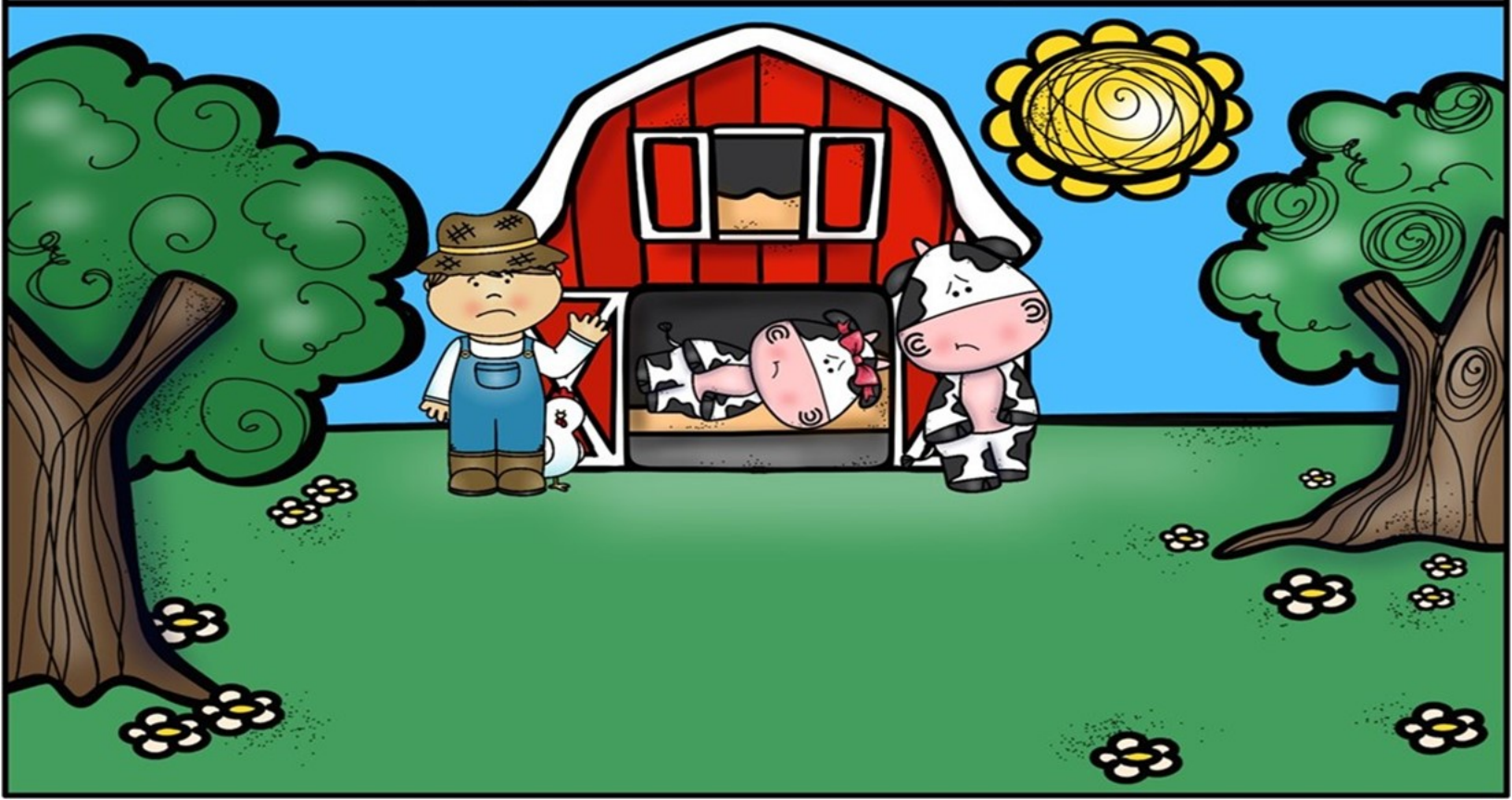

One day while Bessie and her grandma were on a walk together, Nana Cow started to feel sick. Bessie felt really scared to see her grandma not feeling well.



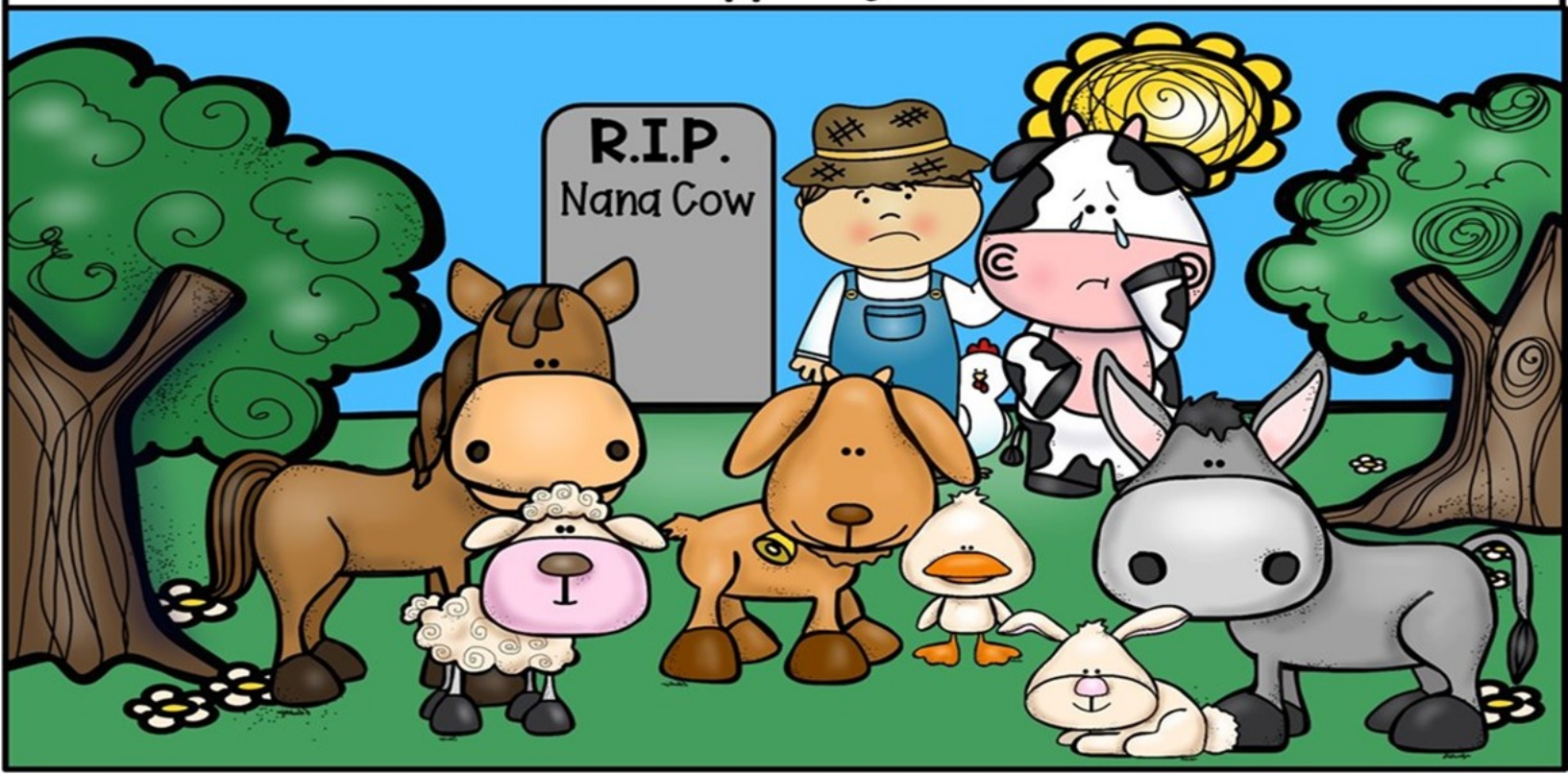
