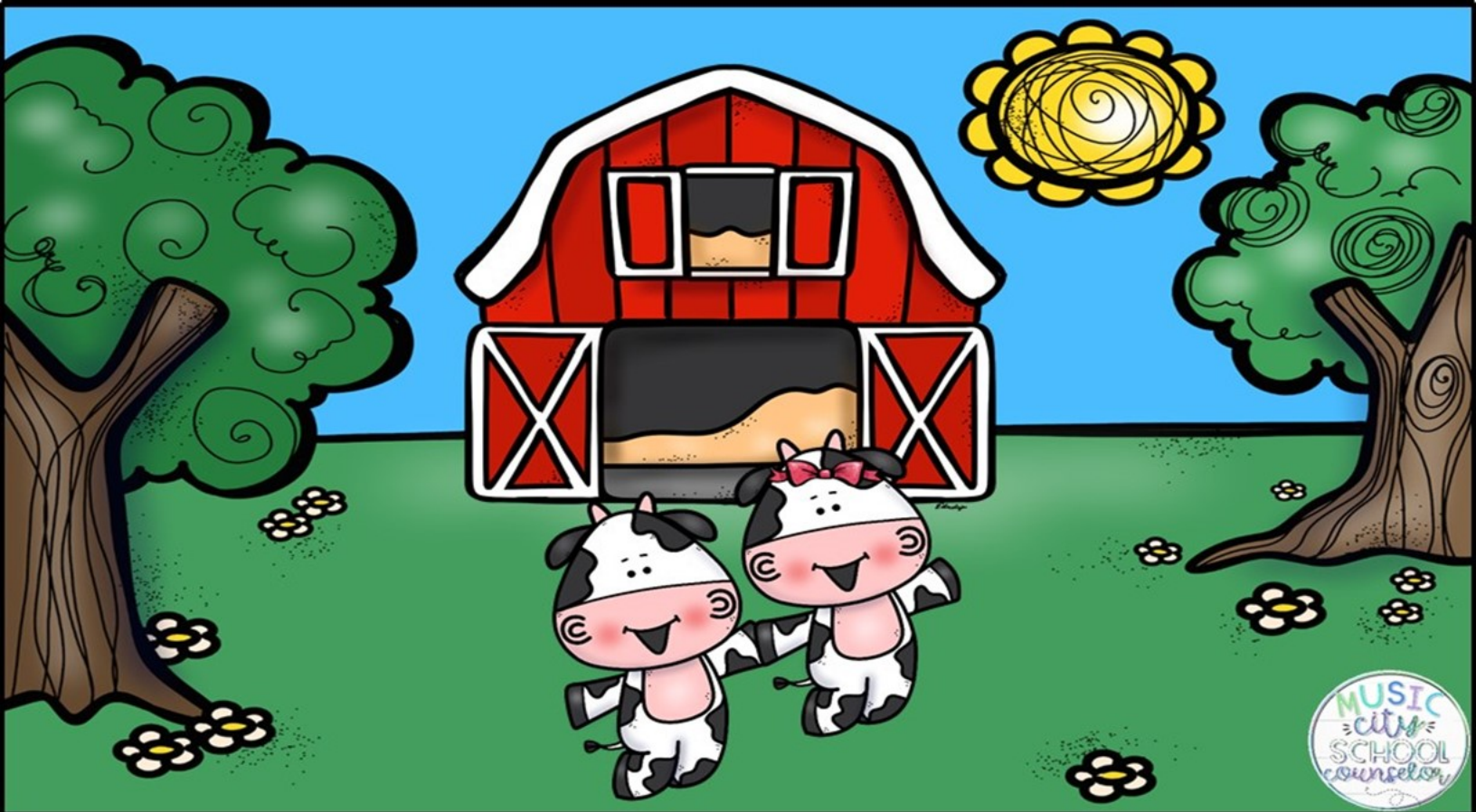
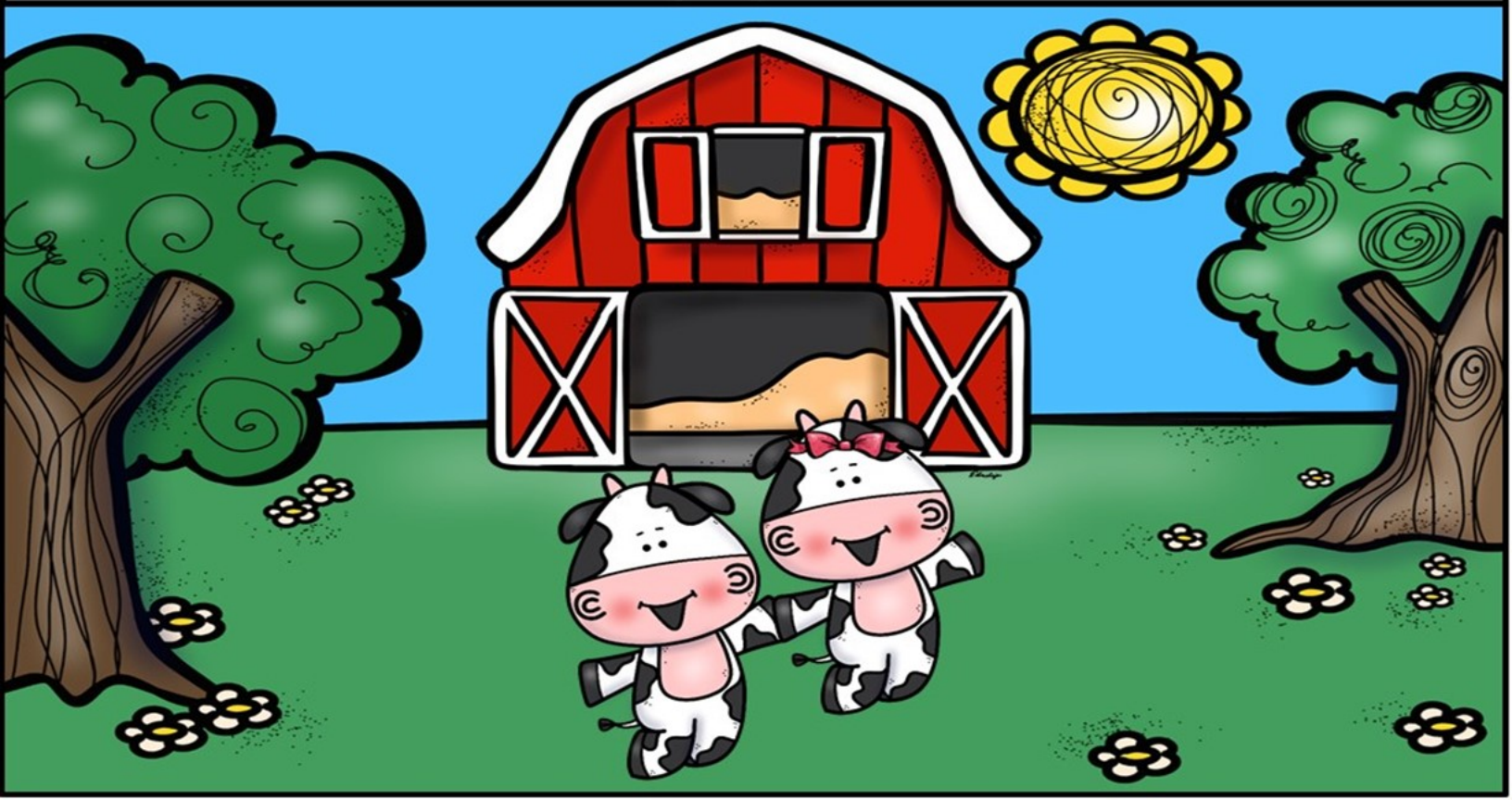

Bessie her sister Daisy were the very best of friends. They loved to roll around in the mud, frolic through the corn fields, and jump in the piles of hay together.

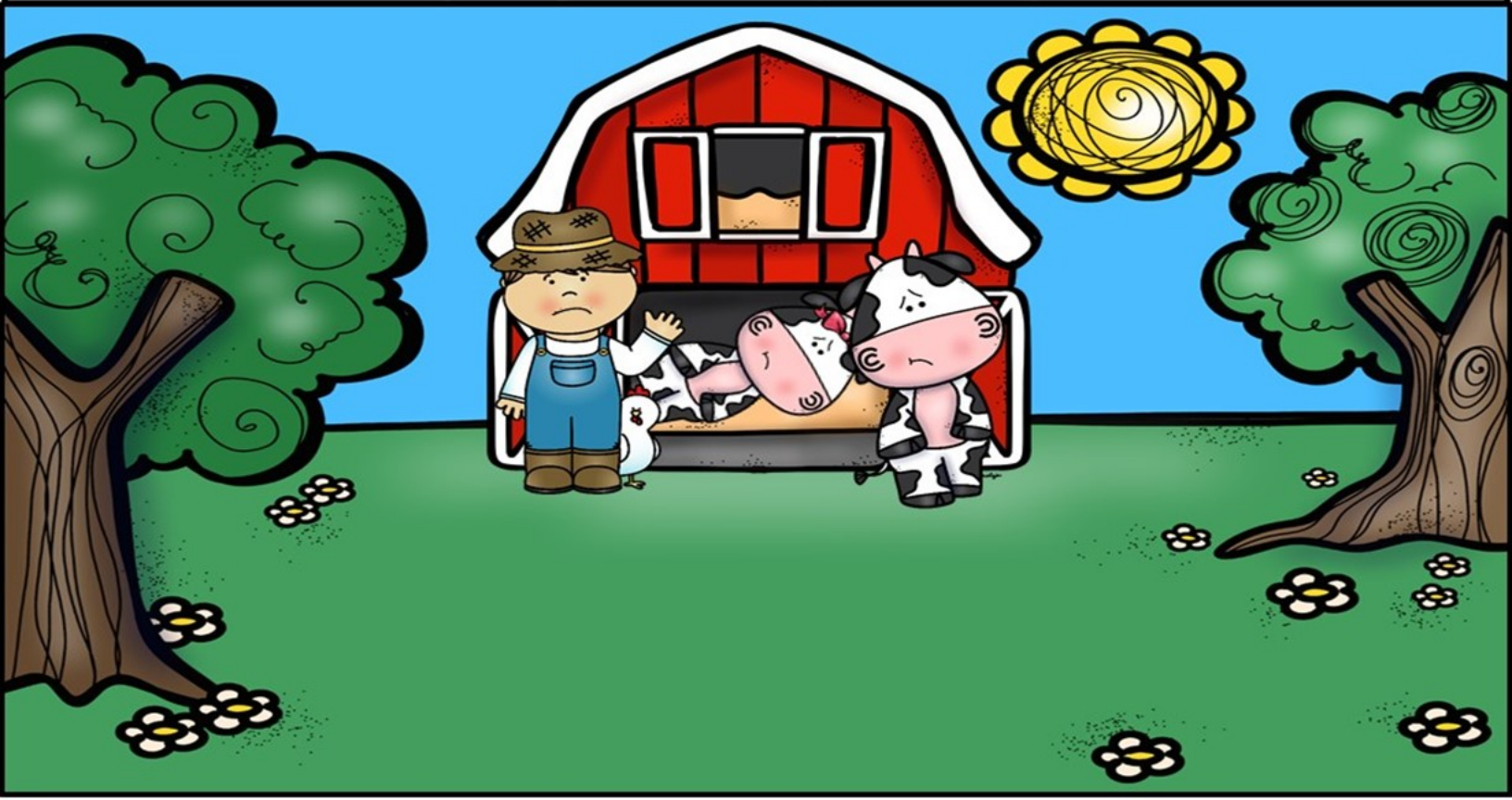




One day while Bessie and Daisy were picking flowers together. Daisy started to feel sick. Bessie felt really scared to see her sister not feeling well.
