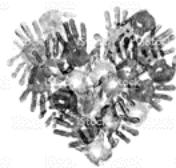

PARENT LETTER

Hello Parents,

We are learning all about Acceptance. We defined acceptance as: Recognizing, appreciating, and respecting those who are different from you.

Here are some ways you can teach Acceptance to your child at home:



Teach your child about new places, people, and cultures through books, music, food, and cultural events. Intervene when you hear or see intolerant behavior and encourage healthier ways they can interact with others.



Model tolerance and respect. Your child will learn to reach out and be sensitive and respectful of others by watching how you discuss, relate to, and value other people. Promoting respect will go a long way in creating a culture in your home that welcomes conversations about differences, seeks to understand the perspective of others, and celebrates differences.



Practice seeing from others' perspectives. Talk to your child about setting aside their thoughts, feelings, motivations, and momentarily think of how someone else must feel. This can be done while watching TV, ask them "Why do you think each character acted that way, how do you think they must feel?"

***Week 1:** We are learning all about Acceptance. We defined acceptance as recognizing, appreciating, and respecting those who are different from you. Some ways you can show acceptance at school are treating others fairly, learning about different cultures, including everyone, and having patience with those that have different abilities.

***Week 2:** We are continuing to learn all about Acceptance. Remember being accepting means recognizing, appreciating, and respecting those who are different from you. Some ways that you can show acceptance at home are appreciating what makes you and others unique, reading books and watching shows about cultures that are different than yours, and not judging someone before you get to know them.

***Week 3:** We are continuing to learn all about Acceptance. Remember acceptance means recognizing, appreciating, and respecting those who are different from you. Some ways that you can show acceptance in your community is by being open-minded, getting to know neighbors who are different from you, being free from bias or prejudice, and being respectful online of different opinions.

***Week 4:** As we continue to learn about Acceptance, let's reflect on this quote by Audre Lorde, "It is not our differences that divide us. It is our inability to recognize, accept, and celebrate those differences." This means that accepting others can bring us together by appreciating our differences. What is one way you will be accepting today?

***Week 5:** Acceptance is an essential trait to have for many careers. Counselors for example show a lot of acceptance. They are trained to give guidance on personal, social, or psychological problems. There are a number of characteristics that counselors must have to be effective, including empathy, communication, listening skills, and being accepting of others' differences. Counselors work with a diverse group of clients and many of them may have different religions, cultures, or views different than their own. They must accept those differences, to create a successful working relationship to make progress with their client. Think of a career you may be interested in and how you can show acceptance within that career.

***Week 6:** Acceptance is also shown by many leaders throughout history and is an important feature of being a leader. One such leader was Mahatma Gandhi, an Indian Lawyer, who used nonviolent protests to achieve India's independence from Britain and inspired movements for civil rights and freedom across the world. Gandhi led campaigns for easing poverty, expanding women's rights, and building religious and ethnic peace. He showed us the importance of being a leader who showed acceptance, he said "*I do not want my house to be walled in on all sides and my windows to be stifled. I want all the cultures of all lands to be blown about my house as freely as possible.*" Think about how you can be a leader in your classroom by showing acceptance.

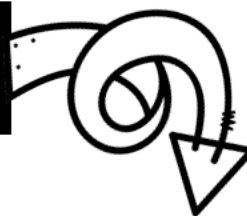
Accepting Students

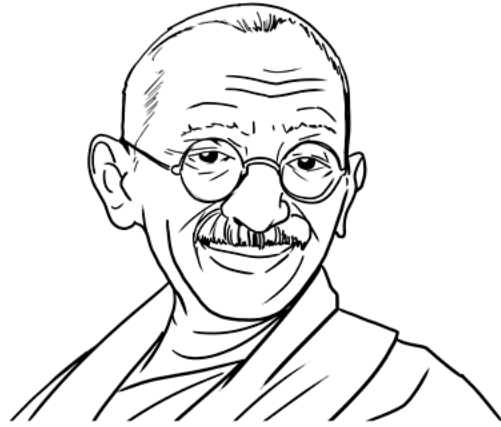

Accepting Leaders

GANDHI



Mahatma Gandhi was an Indian Lawyer, who used nonviolent protests to achieve India's independence from Britain and inspired movements for civil rights and freedom across the world. In 1915, he set about organizing peasants, farmers, and laborers to protest against excessive land tax and discrimination. Assuming leadership of the Indian National Congress, Gandhi led nationwide campaigns for easing poverty, expanding women's rights, and building religious and ethnic peace. He was imprisoned many times for many years because of his efforts. He undertook several hunger strikes to help stop the religious violence within India. He showed us the importance of being a leader who showed acceptance, he said *"I do not want my house to be walled in on all sides and my windows to be stifled. I want all the cultures of all lands to be blown about my house as freely as possible."*

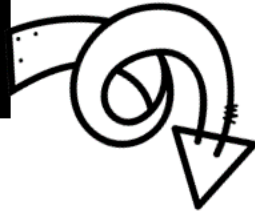
Accepting Careers

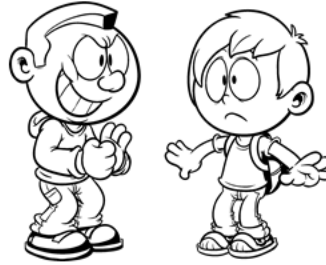
ONLINE DEBATE

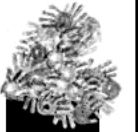


- Encourage students to think about each scenario and what they would do.

ACCEPTANCE COUNSELOR



Counselors are trained to give guidance on personal, social, or psychological problems. They may specialize in certain areas such as marriage counseling or school counseling. There are a number of characteristics that counselors must have to be effective, including empathy, communication, listening skills, and being accepting of others' differences. Counselors work with a diverse group of clients and many of them may have different religions, cultures, or views different than their own. They must accept those differences, to create a successful working relationship to make progress with their client.

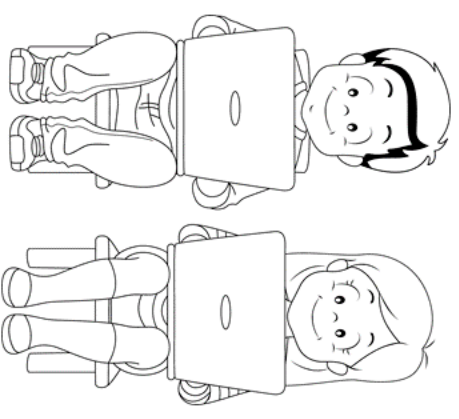

Mahatma Gandhi was an Indian Lawyer, who used nonviolent protests to achieve India's independence from Britain and inspired movements for civil rights and freedom across the world. In 1915, he set about organizing peasants, farmers, and laborers to protest against excessive land tax and discrimination. Assuming leadership of the Indian National Congress, Gandhi led nationwide campaigns for easing poverty, expanding women's rights, and building religious and ethnic peace. He was imprisoned many times for many years because of his efforts. He undertook several hunger strikes to help stop the religious violence within India. He showed us the importance of being a leader who showed acceptance, he said "*I do not want my house to be walled in on all sides and my windows to be stifled. I want all the cultures of all lands to be blown about my house as freely as possible.*"
