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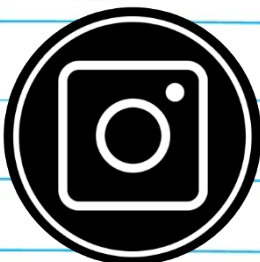

General Google Slides Directions:

1. Please sign in with your Google account.
2. Please click "make a copy" and a copy of the lesson will automatically be saved to your Google Drive.
3. If you are using Google Classroom, please assign the activity as an assignment to your students.
4. If you are not using Google Classroom, you can post the resource to the virtual platform that you are using, or email the link directly to students. If you email the link to students, please make sure that they or their parents have a free Google account first. They will click on the link, sign in with their Google account, and then a copy of the lesson will automatically be saved to their Google Drive. They can then use any device (tablet, smart phone, computer) to access the resource.
5. To use the interactive features of the lesson, please make sure that you are in "edit mode," not in "presentation" full-screen mode.

How to Use the Activity:

- This lesson teaches students all about the many "Pieces of Me" – the parts of our identity that make us special and unique. The first 11 slides focus on the eight "pieces" of our identity that fit perfectly together to form who we are. Then, there are 4 interactive slides for students to work on.
- **Please make sure students are using the presentation in "edit" mode (NOT in full-screen "presentation" mode) or the interactive slides will not work!**
- On slides 13-14, students are tasked with designing a digital puzzle that represents their identity. First, they choose either the girl puzzle or the boy puzzle to work on, and delete the slide they don't need. Then, they type their name in the text box in the middle purple puzzle piece. Next, they drag the face that looks the most like them under their name in the purple puzzle piece, and delete the rest of the faces that they don't need (by pressing the "delete" key). Next, they type in each text box to describe that "piece" of their identity.
- The presentation closes with 6 discussion questions to guide reflection and discussion on diversity issues. Students can type directly in the text boxes.
- Printable activities are also included in the zip folder that you can use to supplement or close the lesson if you'd like!
