***Week 3:** We are continuing to learn all about Responsibility. Remember being responsible means doing the right thing and being accountable for our actions. Some ways that you can be responsible in your community is by recycling, picking up litter, returning library books on time, volunteering, and helping the elderly.

***Week 4:** As we continue to learn about Responsibility let's reflect on this quote by Moliere, "It is not only for what we do that we are held responsible, but also for what we do not do." This means that although you may not have been the person who littered in the park, you have a responsibility to the earth and the community you live in to pick it up and keep your world clean.

***Week 5:** Responsibility is an essential trait to have for many careers. Astronauts for example have a lot of responsibility. The commanders are responsible for flying the space shuttle and keeping the crew safe. Mission Specialists coordinate the operation within the spacecraft, keeping it functional and livable. They all work together to be able to survive space travel. Each person has to do their responsibilities to make this happen. Think of a career you may be interested in and what the responsibilities of that career would entail.

***Week 6:** Responsibility is also shown by many leaders throughout history and is An important feature of being a leader. Spiderman once said, "With great power, comes great responsibility." One such leader was Charles R. Drew. He was a teacher, physician and medical researcher. His research on blood transfusions allowed for large scale blood banks in World War II. Thousands of lives were saved because of his research. This success led to his appointment as Director of the Red Cross Blood Bank. As the most prominent African American in the field, Dr. Drew protested against the practice of racial segregation in the donation of blood because it had no scientific basis and resigned from his position. Dr. Drew felt a responsibility to his field and human rights that he took at stand. What is something important to you that would take responsibility for and take a stand?

ASTRONAUT



Astronauts conduct experiments and gather information in space, they also experiment with spacecraft to develop new design and engineering concepts as well as navigation of the spacecraft. The commander and pilot share the responsibility of managing the flight of the spacecraft. The commander is in charge of the crew and their safety. Mission Specialists coordinate the operation within the spacecraft, keeping it functional and livable. They monitor the technology, crew member activities, and inventory such as food supply.

TIPS FOR USING CARDS



- Encourage students to think about each scenario and what they would do.
- Pair students together to have them take turns answering the task cards.
- Use the task cards during centers having students answer in small groups.
- To make it a writing activity, have students write their responses on paper or in their journals.
- For a class wide activity or morning meeting, use the included PowerPoint slides

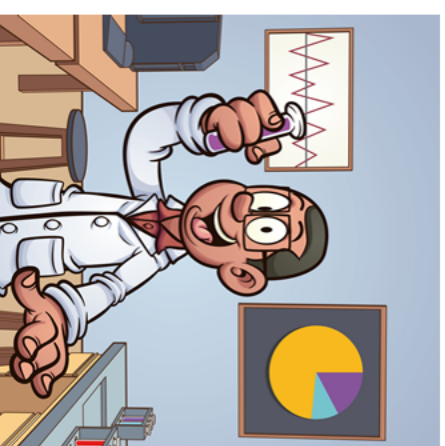


ASTRONAUTS

Astronauts conduct experiments and gather information in space. The commander and pilot share the responsibility of managing the flight of the spacecraft. The commander is in charge of the crew and their safety. Mission Specialists coordinate the operation within the spacecraft, keeping it functional and livable. They monitor the technology, crew member activities, and inventory. Each Astronaut has critical responsibilities that contribute to a successful and safe trip to space.

CHARLES R. DREW

Charles R. Drew was a teacher, physician and medical researcher. His research on blood transfusions allowed for large scale blood banks in World War II. Thousands of lives were saved because of his research. This success led to his appointment as Director of the Red Cross Blood Bank. As the most prominent African American in the field, Dr. Drew protested against the practice of racial segregation in the donation of blood because it had no scientific basis and resigned from his position. He felt a responsibility to his profession and human rights and did what was right instead of what was easy.
