How to Use the Digital Activity:

- 1) The activity teaches all about sportsmanship and how to be a team player. First, the presentation shares a story about a boy named Henry who learns an important lesson about how to be a good sport. Then, students learn what sportsmanship means and practical ways they can be a good sport and positive team member. Then, an interactive activity lets students read 23 scenarios and decide whether it is a "good sport" choice or a "poor sport" choice. Then, they drag the soccer ball to the box that matches their answer. On the last slide, students can type in the text box how they can be a good sport.
