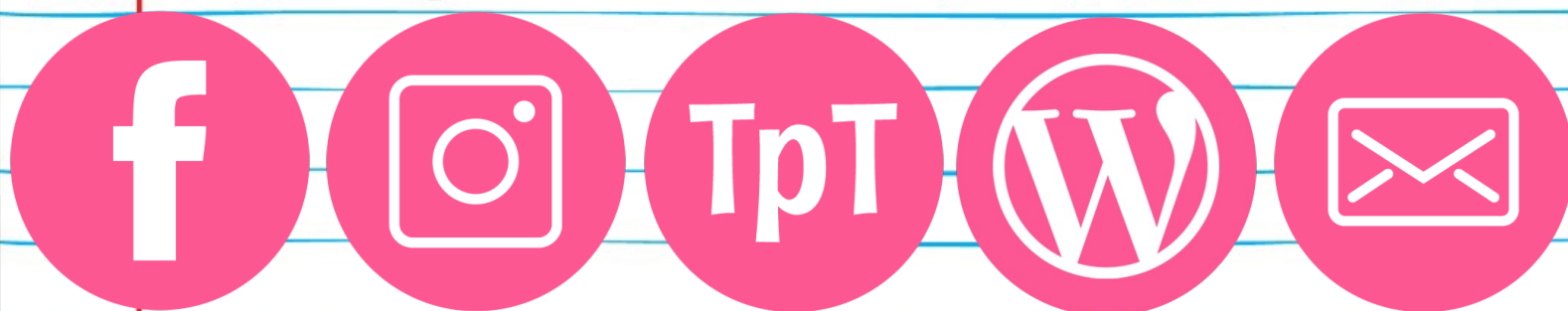

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Diversity Lesson Directions:

- This lesson teaches students that diversity is beautiful. It starts by asking students to compare their thoughts and feelings about 2 different gardens: one that has flowers that are all the same, and one that has flowers that are all different. Discussion questions are written on each slide. Ask students to "Turn and Talk" with a neighbor about the questions and then share their responses with the class. Then, the presentation relates people to the garden metaphor and the concept of diversity.
 - Next, the presentation teaches students 5 reasons why diversity is beautiful.
 - Then, it tells students that we are going to "meet" kids from diverse backgrounds. It offers several questions that students can ponder as they learn about each diverse kid. A total of 24 diverse kids are included. You may choose to have students explore as many kids as you'd like! I suggest asking a different volunteer to come to the front of the

room to read each slide aloud to the class, introducing that kid to their classmates. Then, they can choose any of the discussion questions to answer and spark a conversation with their peers. Continue sharing diverse kids as time allows.
