PARENT LETTER

Hello Parents,

Our students are learning about the value of honesty — telling the truth, taking responsibility, and building trust through words and actions. Honesty is one of the most important character traits for middle school students to develop as they grow into responsible young adults. Here are a few simple ways you can help encourage honesty at home:

- Model honesty.** Children learn by example. When you tell the truth — even in small situations — you show your child that honesty matters in everyday life.
- Praise truth-telling.** When your child admits a mistake, thank them for being honest before addressing the behavior. This helps them see that telling the truth is valued and safe.
- Talk about “why.”** Discuss how honesty builds trust in friendships, families, and teams. Help your child understand that being truthful strengthens relationships.
- Discuss tough situations.** Ask how they might handle moments when honesty feels hard — like when they’ve made a mistake, are embarrassed, or want to fit in.
- Be calm when they tell the truth.** If children fear punishment, they may be tempted to hide the truth. Responding calmly helps them feel safe to be honest in the future.

SAMPLE ROLE PLAY SCENARIOS

- Forgot to Study: You forgot to study for a quiz and are tempted to sneak a look at someone else's paper. What do you do?
- Plagiarism Temptation: You find a perfect answer to your assignment online. Do you copy it or write your own in your own words?
- Taking Credit: A group project goes really well because of your partner's hard work, but the teacher praises you. Do you speak up?
- Gossiping and Denial: You told a friend's secret and now they're upset. When asked about it, you want to lie to avoid conflict. What should you do?
- Lying to Fit In: You exaggerate or make up a story to seem cool or fit in with a group. A classmate calls you out. How do you handle it?
- Caught Cheating in a Game: You're playing a game and cheat to win. A classmate notices and calls you out. Do you deny it or admit what you did?
- False Accusation: You saw who actually took something from a locker, but someone else is getting blamed. Do you stay silent or tell the truth?

***Week 1:** We are learning all about Honesty. We defined being honest as saying or doing what is truthful and being straightforward. Some ways you can be honest at school are following the rules, admitting a mistake, being accountable for your actions, keeping your eyes on your own paper, and making sure your work is your own.

This means that honesty can be difficult, and it may not be what is always easy and popular, but it will attract the right kind of people to you and those are the kind of people you want in your life. 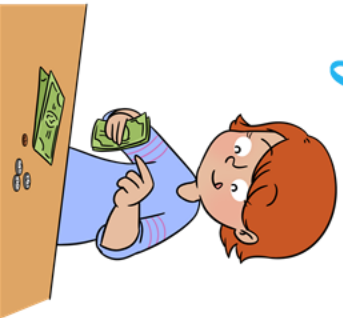
***Week 5:** Honesty is an essential trait to have for many careers. Doctors for example show a lot of honesty. They are licensed health professionals who maintain and restore their patient's health through the practice of medicine. Doctors must maintain their patient's confidentiality and collect sensitive information. Once they examine results, they are responsible for determining a treatment plan and explaining the procedure and prescribed treatments to their patients in a compassionate and honest way. Think of a career you may be interested in and how you can show honesty within that career.

***Week 6:** Kindness is also shown by many leaders throughout history and is an important feature of being a leader. One such leader was Abraham Lincoln, the 16th president of the U.S. He was often referred to as "Honest Abe" due to his long career ruled by honesty, truth, and integrity. He earned his nickname when he was working as a young store clerk. Later on, his good name helped win him four consecutive terms in the legislature. 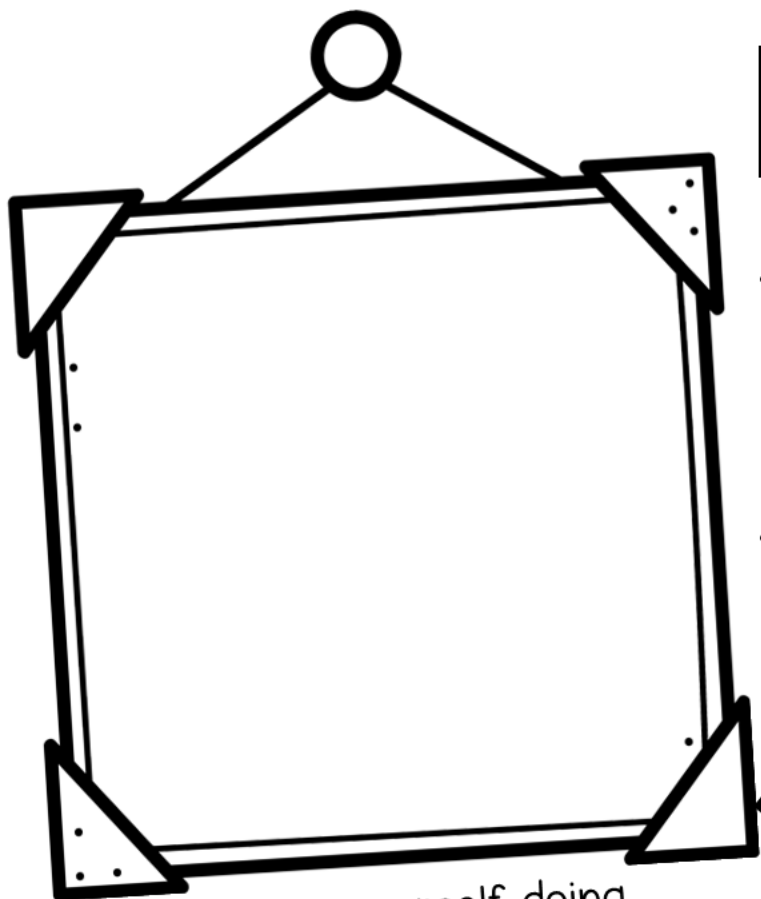

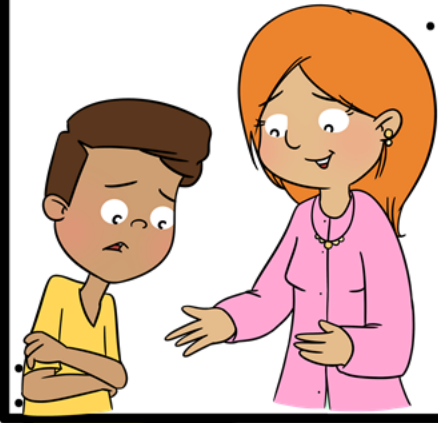

Abraham Lincoln was the 16th president of the United States. He was often referred to as "Honest Abe" due to his long career ruled by honesty, truth, and integrity. He earned his nickname when he was working as a young store clerk. His honest reputation grew, and he was asked to be a judge and mediator in contests and fights. Lincoln's judgment was final in that region of the country. ABRAHAM LINCOLN

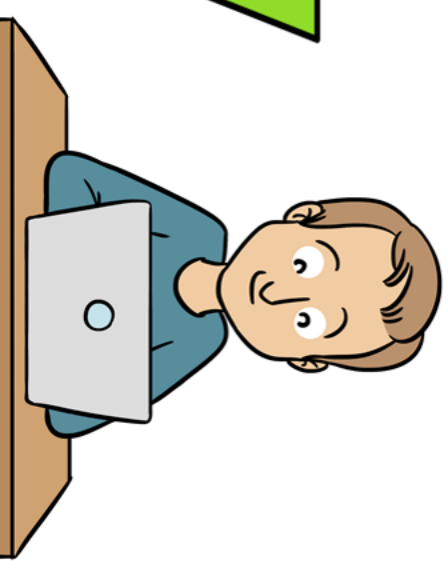


Lincoln was the 16th president of the United States. He was often referred to as “Honest Abe” due to his long career ruled by honesty, truth, and integrity. He

earned his nickname when he was working as a young store clerk. Whenever he realized that he shortchanged a customer even by a few pennies, he would close the shop and deliver the correct change, no matter how far he had to walk. His honest reputation grew as he was asked to be a judge and mediator in contests and fights. Lincoln’s judgment was final in that region of the country. Later on, his good name helped win him four consecutive terms in the legislature. He showed us the importance of being an honest leader, he said “*I am glad of all the support I can get anywhere, if I can get it without practicing any deception to obtain it.*”
