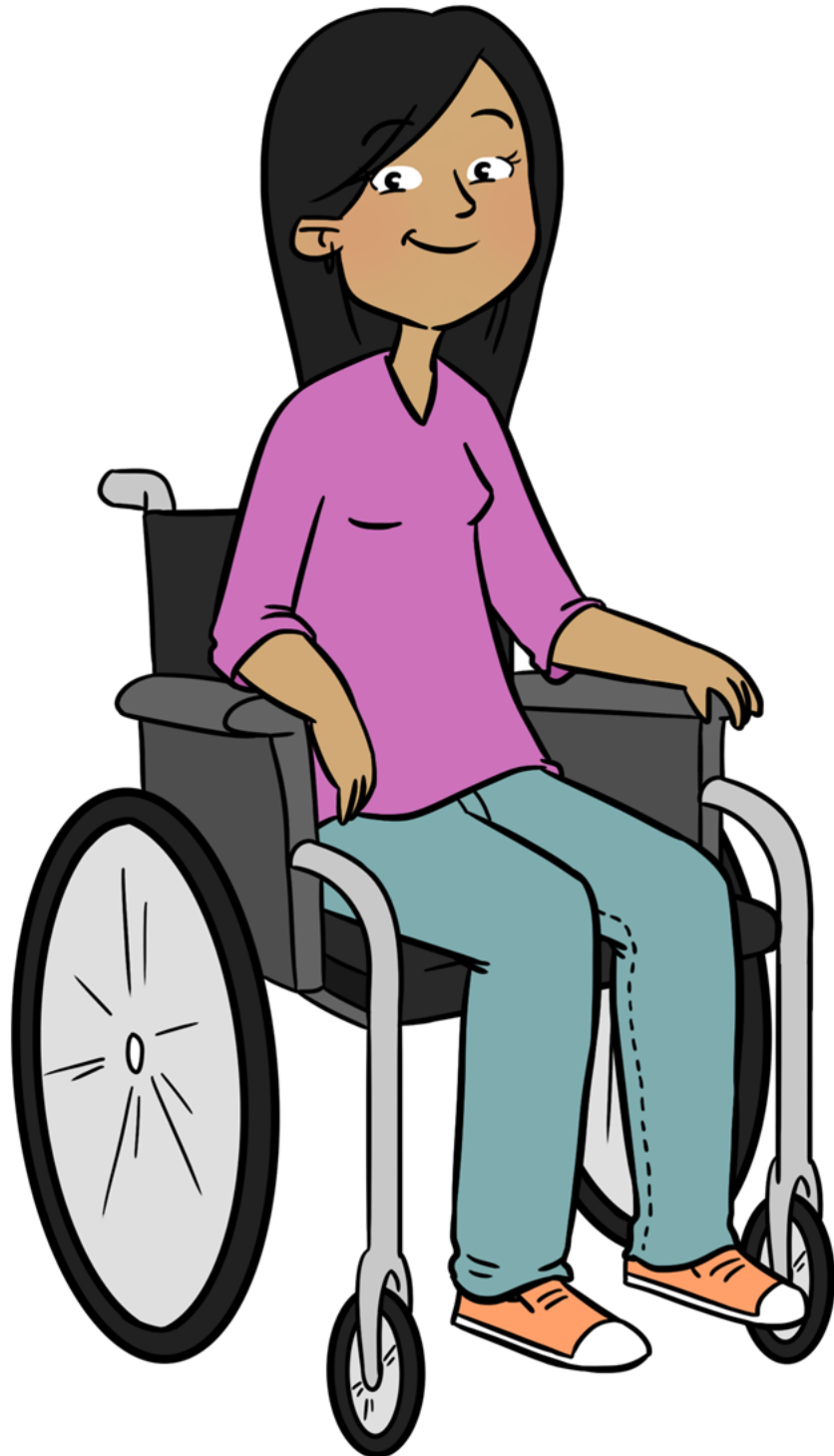

PARENT LETTER

Dear Parents and Guardians,

At school, we encourage students to show respect by listening to others, using kind language, following expectations, and celebrating differences. We know that these skills are reinforced best when teachers, families, and caregivers work together.

Here are a few ways you can continue supporting respect at home:

1. Model respectful communication. Speak to each other with patience, even during disagreements. Children learn from the way adults handle conflict.
2. Set clear expectations. Talk about respectful behavior — like using polite language, listening when others speak, and helping around the house — and follow through consistently.
3. Encourage responsibility and independence. When students complete tasks and make positive choices, they feel valued and learn to respect themselves and others.
4. Acknowledge respectful choices. Noticing and praising acts of respect helps strengthen them. A simple “Thank you for speaking kindly” goes a long way.

By practicing these skills at home, students are better prepared to navigate friendships, communicate confidently, and contribute to a respectful school community. We are grateful for your partnership as we help our middle schoolers grow into responsible, respectful young people.

***Week 1:** We are learning all about Respect. We defined being respect as showing consideration, understanding, and regard for people, places, and things. Some ways you can be respectful at school are sharing, thinking before you speak, following the rules, listening to your teacher, and taking care of classroom items.

***Week 2:** We are continuing to learn all about Respect. Remember being respectful means treating others the way you want to be treated. Some ways that you can be respectful at home are sharing with a sibling, doing your chores, taking care of your belongings, using good manners at the dinner table, and keeping your room clean.

***Week 3:** We are continuing to learn all about Respect. Remember being respectful means showing consideration and regard for others. Some ways that you can be respectful in your community is helping an elderly neighbor, being polite when eating at a restaurant, being quiet at a movie theater, and putting trash in the trash can.

***Week 4:** As we continue to learn about Respect, let's reflect on this quote, "Respect is a mirror, the more you show it to other people, the more they will reflect it back." This means that you need to show others respect, if you want to be treated with respect. What is one way you will be respectful today?

***Week 5:** Respect is an essential trait to have for many careers. Pilots for example show a lot of respect. Pilots fly and navigate airplanes and other types of aircraft. Airplanes operate by a cockpit crew which are the captain and co-pilot. They work together to steer the plane, monitor the instruments, perform safety inspections, and communicate with air traffic controllers. Their most important role is to ensure the safety of the passengers on the plane. Pilots should be able to multitask, work as a team, problem-solve, have a professional demeanor and be respectful to crew and passengers. Think of a career you may be interested in and how you can show respect within that career.

***Week 6:** Respect is shown by leaders throughout history and is an important feature of being a leader. One such leader is Temple Grandin, a Scientist and activist. She is an advocate for the humane treatment of livestock and has written over 60 scientific papers about animal behavior. She also is an autism spokesperson, documenting her own experience with autism. Through her work, Temple has provided insight into the minds of cattle. She designed a curved corral to reduce the stress and panic for the animals when herding them. She showed us the importance of respecting animals and credits her compassion for the animals to her autism. She says she can see the animals' reality from their viewpoint and feels a deep connection to them. She said, "*We've got to give those animals a decent life, we owe the animals respect.*" Think about how you can be a leader in your classroom by showing respect.

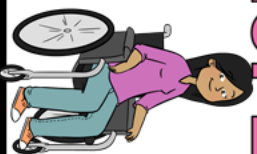

LEADERS WITH RESPECT TEMPLE GRANDIN



Mary Temple Grandin is an American Scientist and activist. She is an advocate for the humane treatment of livestock and has written over 60 scientific papers about animal behavior. She also is an autism spokesperson, documenting her own experience with autism. Through her work, Temple Grandin has provided insight into the minds of cattle. She designed a curved corral to reduce the stress and panic for the animals when herding them. She showed us the importance of respecting animals and credits her compassion for the animals to her autism. She says she can see the animals' reality from their viewpoint and feels a deep connection to animals. She said, "*We've got to give those animals a decent life, we owe the animals respect.*"
