1. Please sign in with your Google account.
2. Please click "make a copy" and a copy of the lesson will automatically be saved to your Google Drive.
3. If you are using Google Classroom, please assign the activity to your students.
4. If you are not using Google Classroom, you can use this presentation in-person on a device, post the resource to the virtual platform that you are using, or email the link directly to students. If you email the link to students, please make sure that they or their parents have a free Google account first. They will click on the link, sign in with their Google account, and then a copy of the lesson will automatically be saved to their Google Drive. They can then use any device (tablet, smart phone, computer) to access the resource.

Presentation Directions:

- More detailed directions, a parent letter, discussion cards, posters, and worksheets are all included in the zip folder.
- The lesson starts with an icebreaker game called "Find Someone Who." You can find the game and the directions to play in the printables file!
- The presentation starts with **defining puberty** for boys. The lesson teaches boys **7 things to expect during puberty** (to get stinky, get oily skin and pimples, grow taller and gain weight, have a lower voice, grow hair in new places, have mood swings, and changes in private parts).
- Throughout the presentation, there are several opportunities for students to **"turn and talk"** with a partner and share.
- As you discuss each of the 7 changes, I recommend passing around **hygiene items** so students can experience them firsthand. For example, when you discuss hygiene, pass around different types of deodorant and face wash for the boys to smell, touch, etc. When you discuss shaving, pass around different types of razors (with the cover on!) and shaving cream for the boys.
- Be sure to leave plenty of time for questions at the end! I also recommend making a **"Question Box"** out of a shoe box and giving each girl a notecard. At the end of the presentation, boys can write any questions they have on their notecard that they may feel too embarrassed to ask in front of the group and place them in the question box. You may choose to answer them then, or ask the boys to write their names on them and pull them privately to answer their questions at a later date.
